

# **Driving Test Automatic Disqualifications**

( not limited to the following)

**A.** Dangerous Act. Any act which interferes with other vehicles, pedestrians or otherwise could be considered an act or action that endangers lives or property shall constitute immediate failure.

1. Fails to use best possible vision at blind intersection with other traffic present.
2. Causes other vehicle(s) or pedestrians(s) to take evasive action to avoid a collision.
3. Loss of control to the extent that a collision is possible.
4. Makes left or right turn from wrong lane (traffic present)
5. Makes lane change without looking to the rear (traffic present)
6. Fails to yield to pedestrian in crosswalk.
7. Stops unnecessarily in roadway (traffic involved).
8. Examiner has to take control or tell driver to stop to avoid an accident.
9. Any wheel over curb.

**B.** Violation. Any act contrary to state law or city ordinance that the Examiner feels is flagrant enough to justify summons shall constitute immediate failure. Examples:

1. Fails to stop at stop sign or red light

2. Left of Center (except when need to perform a turn safely or any other lawful reason).
3. Fails to fasten seat belt before entering a public street or highway.
4. Fails to wear corrective lens when restricted.
5. Driver's speed is more than five (5) miles per hour over the posted speed limit or the lawful speed limit for the vehicle being driven: Provided the speeding is not in a school zone during normal school hours and school is in session or in a construction zone with workers present.

**C. An individual's refusal to comply with the Examiner's instructions while the road test is being conducted constitutes an immediate failure. Violation. (Does not apply to failing to following instructions.)**

**D. Points Failure**

1. Failure based on points/deductions that result in minimum scores not being met during a road test. 75

**E. Weighted Offenses Failure**

1. Accumulation of four (4) or more of any of the following offenses in any combination.
  - a. Failure to use signal
  - b. Coasting on a downgrade
  - c. Enters intersection on yellow light when could have stopped with creating a dangerous situation.
  - d. Consistently exceeds speed limit.
